

Owen Charters has been President & CEO of Boys & Girls Clubs of Canada since 2016, where he is deeply invested in the work of Clubs across the country – work that is vital to give each and every child and youth that passes through our doors the opportunity to grow and build on their ambitions. While he doesn't get to work directly with kids on a day-to-day basis anymore, he cherishes visits to Clubs and being in the middle of the activities, where you can sometimes hear his 'camp counsellor voice' in action.

Born in Toronto, raised in St. John's, Owen has worked with many non-profit organizations through his career, including youth-serving organizations like the YM-YWCA and Easter Seals. In executive leadership roles, he has focused on marketing and fundraising to raise the profile and grow the impact of various health charities and hospital foundations, and at Canada Helps, to encourage technologically-enabled philanthropy. A proponent of a strong, collective voice for the non-profit sector, Owen is a member of the Advisory Committee for the School for Advanced Studies in the Arts and Humanities at Western University, a board member of Common Good—a pension plan for the non-profit sector, and former chair of Imagine Canada. He holds a BA from the University of Western Ontario, and an MBA and a Graduate Diploma in Non-profit Management, both from the Schulich School of Business, York University. He is an adjunct member of York's faculty, lecturing at the MBA-level on non-profit management.
